Alternative methods of funding public school construction including: public-private partnerships, sale-leaseback, competitive negotiation vs competitive bidding and other financing, construction arrangements. MD Stadium Authority would administer alternative financing and bonds. Prince George’s would have special financing options; The Interagency Commission for School Construction must approve plans and develop regulations for state-local cost-sharing for counties with 20,000 or fewer full-time students.
