Club Awards — Blueprint to Club Success

This year, I was asked to chair MFRW's Awards Committee. I thought, "piece of cake -- clubs send you their applications, you verify the minimum requirements, and then present the awards". Quite honestly though, as an MFRW member since 2002 (including a term or two as club president), I never gave much thought to club awards, left it up to others to handle, and never thought they mattered all that much. Well, was I wrong, so wrong! I now know that MFRW awards are vastly different from the Girl Scout badges I earned in my youth.

After my first cycle as Awards Chair, I know realize that the Awards Program is a blueprint for success -- an amazing baseline for understanding how to build and maintain a MFRW club. The depth and breadth of the club experiences are measured in meetings held, volunteer hours collected, new members, community involvement, political involvement, literacy program involvement, etc.

After reviewing the 19 club submissions, I now see the method to the madness. These were not just checkmarks on a list but rather small points in a greater plan. In the end, it was easy to see that the MFRW philosophy -coming together as a collective force advancing Republicanism, positively impacting our State and Nation politically, empowering women and increasing their effectiveness as community leaders -- is moved forward by following the club awards blueprint.

We moved our annual awards presentation to the Spring Board meeting this year in the hopes that earlier recognition of past accomplishments will encourage each of MFRW's 27 clubs to submit an awards application for 2022. In the near future, we will be offering an **Awards Workshop** to foster ideas for a stronger awards program and a streamlined submission process, and to clarify awards requirements.

I thank all who submitted 2021 awards applications – keep up the good work – you are making a difference. I look forward to working with club presidents and awards committee chairs to encourage submission of a 2022 awards application.

MFRW Spring Tea


May 21st at Normandie Farm

I commend all these immigrants for speaking out bravely because many are afraid to speak up in AMERICA.

Jim Simpson, author of "Who Was Karl Marx?" was the moderator at the club's April general meeting. His book is factual and a quick read. It traces the history of communism and how these ideologies are permeating America today. Jim's book can be ordered on Amazon.com.

Amal Torres was born in Mogadishu, Somalia. She came to the United States in the 90's with her mother to escape the Somalia war. Amal has served our country in the military and has an extensive background in intelligence. Amal stated, "I have lost one country and do not want to lose another one." Blanca Tapahuasco is from El Salvador and escaped her country under deplorable conditions. She graphically described her horrific experience and the "sounds of war." She further explained the atrocities of war, rations, death, and isolation. Blanca was adopted by a family in the United States. She explained how she sees our freedom being taken away in this country, particularly the shift of power from the people to the government. Nino SuJash was born in the Eastern European country of Georgia. Her parents had described to her the lack of water, food, and jobs under Communism. There was no freedom of speech or religion, fear permeated their lives.

The last guest was Vitaly Cherpak from Ukraine. His family's property was taken away from them under a Communist regime. He stated, "Socialism may sound fair and like a good deal, but the reality is that the government owns you and you have no freedom."



In recent years, monies from the Legacy Fund, a unique investment account spearheaded by then-MFRW President Betty Jane Carroll in 2005, have allowed the annual Leadership Conference in January and "Red Scarf" Legislative Day in Annapolis during the General Assembly's Session to be held free of charge for all MFRW members.

The Bay Club has therefore changed its focus to include additional ways of supporting MFRW members, among them providing printed copies of the now quarterly *Trumpeter* newsletter to all MFRW members without e-mail accounts, to club and regional leaders, and to all individuals featured in club stories. This has proven to be very popular, promoting camaraderie and familiarity among our clubs.

The cost of a Bay Club membership remains \$110 for both individuals and clubs. In return, members are invited to special appreciation events (a club may send one member to each activity) and receive printed copies of the *Trumpeter*. Membership runs from January through the end of December of each year.
