This combined effort is comprised of the Chevy Chase Women's Republican Club, Potomac Women's Republican Club, Rural Women's Republican Club, Upper Montgomery Republican Women's Club, the Montgomery County Federation of Republican Women and the Montgomery County Republican Central Committee. They not only show their physical support at each visit, but also support financially in their yearly budgets. This public outreach is in keeping with our Caring for America promise, as well as our support for law and order in Montgomery County.

As part of this effort, we provide lunch -- usually the main course and drinks to each of the 6 police districts.
